PROSPECTUS

Mahesh Sri Ramkrishna Ashram Vidyalaya (H.S.), a recognized Government Aided Higher Secondary School, is going to conduct a Selection Test for appointment to the posts of Assistant Teacher against vacancies advertised herewith, in conformity with the autonomy regulations issued for Mahesh Shri Ramakrishna Ashram by the Government of West Bengal.

The Selection Test is going to be held in terms of: -

1. The West Bengal School Service Commission (Amended) Act, 2012 as notified in the Kolkata Gazette dated 05.09.2012.
2. G.O. No – 1013/SE(Law) SL/5S -113/12(PT), Dt.: 19.08.2013
3. G.O. No – 611-SE(S)/10R-10/2013, Dt.: 07.07.2015

Eligibility & Essential Qualifications: -

1. Eligibility:

Any **Male/Female** citizen of **India** may apply for the posts advertised. No candidate can apply for more than one post of the same designation (i.e. Asst. Teachers).

2. Essential Qualification Required:

- a) Every candidate shall require to possess such relevant qualifications as mentioned in the West Bengal School Service Commission (selection of persons for Appointment to the Post of Asst. Teachers) Rules, 2007 and as subsequently amended.
- b) Moreover, B.Ed. or an equivalent degree in Teachers' Training is mandatory for the posts of Assistant Teacher.

3. Age:

Minimum 20 years as on 01.01.2025 (i.e., not born after 01.01.2005) & maximum 40 years as on 01.01.2025 (i.e., not born before 01.01.1985) for Gen category.

• **Relaxation:**

Upper Age limit is relaxable by 5 years for SC/ST, 3 years for OBC (both A & B category), 8 years for Physically Handicapped candidates having disability of 40% and above.

4. Method of Recruitment:

The Recruitment shall be made on the basis of selection through direct recruitment process.

6. Salary Structure:

Salary will be fixed as per the latest ROPA.

7. Medium of Instruction in the Institution applied for:

A candidate willing to be selected as an **Assistant Teacher** in Mahesh Sri Ramkrishna Ashram Vidyalaya (H.S.) (Bengali Medium), must have Bengali as first or second at any of the Secondary or Higher Secondary or at any subsequent higher level of education.

8. Question Paper:

There will be both objective and subjective questions. Questions will be set in Bengali and English. Answers are also to be written either in Bengali or in English. *There will be no negative marking.*

9. Syllabus:

Syllabus for the written examination will contain two parts:

a) Part I:

Containing questions related to the subject for which the candidate has applied. For detailed syllabus, visit our website: <https://recruitment.msarka.org/>.

b) Part II:

10. Allotment of Marks:

a) The total marks allotted to the written examination shall be fifty-five (55) which will be divided into two parts as mentioned below:

- In Part I, marks will be 45.
- In Part II, marks will be 10.



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- b) The marks allotted to academic including professional qualifications will be 35.
The Marks allotted shall be such as mentioned in *vide G.O. No. 1105-SE/S/IS-26/2010(Pt.-III) dated 20.09.2016* and *1106-SE/S/IS-26/2010(Pt.-III) dated 20.09.2016*
- c) The marks for the Personality Test shall be 10
(*Viva-voce: 5 marks* and *Classroom Demonstration: 5 marks*)

11. Application Procedure:

Application forms will be available only on our website <https://recruitment.msarka.org/> from **02/03/2025**. Candidates can download and print the Application Form and Acknowledgement Sheet on 75 GSM, A4 white paper (in separate pages) from the website. Duly filled in Application Form & Acknowledgement Sheet can be submitted **by hand only** (no other communication method will be entertained) from **04/03/2025** to **18/03/2025** (from 12:00 Noon to 4:00 p.m.), excluding Sundays and holidays at our **“MAHESH SHRI RAMAKRISHNA ASHRAM” MAIN OFFICE** at **“SWAMI SOMANANDA BHAWAN” Ground Floor**.

Use **BLACK BALL POINT PEN** only to fill in the application form. Before filling, please read this prospectus properly.

Overwriting and use of white ink are strictly prohibited. Applicants shall not use typed/handwritten copy of the said form. Such forms may be rejected.

Note: Admission to the selection process is purely provisional subject to verification of the candidate's eligibility at various stages. Candidature of the applicant will be cancelled at any stage if any discrepancy or untrue statement is detected.

12. Fees for Examination:

Rs. 1000/- (Rs. One Thousand only) for *General candidates*, Rs. 900/- (Rs. Nine hundred only) for the *reserved category candidates* and Rs. 800/- (Rs. Eight hundred only) for the *Physically Handicapped candidates having disability of 40% and above candidates* (not refundable under any circumstances). Please Tender exact amount only. At the time of submission of the Form this amount is to be deposited by *cash or UPI*.

13. Admit Card:

Admit Cards for written examination shall be issued by the Secretary, Mahesh Sri Ramkrishna Ashram Vidyalaya (H.S.), Rishra, Hooghly. Admit Cards will be sent by 'Speed Post'. Specific schedule for the issue of Admit Card will be intimated through our website at the time of publication of the list of eligible candidates for written examination.

14. The schedule of Written Examination:

For the post of Asstt. Teacher duration of the written examination will be 90 minutes. Duration, Date, time and venue for the written examination will be mentioned on the 'Admit Card'.

15. Method of selection:

- Step I :** After receiving the application forms, a list of eligible candidates along with the schedule for date, time and venue for the written examination will be published on our website and in school notice board.
A Separate list of rejected applicants will also be published.



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- Step II :** A shortlist of the candidates (subject wise) will be prepared based on the marks secured in the written examination, plus the marks awarded against his academic and professional qualifications. These short listed candidates will be called for the Personality Test through a letter sent by 'Speed Post with AD' and 'E-mail'.
- Step III:** The Personality Test will be of 10 marks and includes test on ability of handling classroom situation and viva-voce. Appearance for the Personality Test is compulsory.
- Step IV:** A cumulative merit list based on marks obtained in the written examination, academic including professional qualification and the marks obtained in the Personality Test, post wise, will be published along with the marks and rankings on the website and School Notice Board.

16. No Objection Certificate:

The candidature of an in-service teacher or non-teaching staff of a school or any Govt. employee shall not be considered at the time of interview, if he fails to produce a No-Objection Certificate from the President/Secretary of the school or relevant competent authority.

17. Panel:

The final Panel shall be prepared on merit basis according to the total marks obtained by the candidates in the Written Test, Academic including Professional Qualifications and the marks obtained in the Personality Test, post-wise.

Note: In case, grand total marks obtained by two or more candidates becomes equal, the preference will be given to the candidate who scores more marks in written examination first, subsequently on academic qualifications further on the performance in the personality test, further on the higher age.

18. Appointment:

- The appointment process will be set as per the notification 175-SE/JS/13 dated 27.08.2013 clause 16.
- After receiving the approval of the final Panel from the School Managing Committee and the A.D.I. (SE), the school authority shall issue the appointment letter to the 1st rank holder in the Panel, post-wise.



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-: GENERAL INFORMATION:-

A. Disqualification of the candidates:

1. Disqualification norms will be followed as mentioned in the West Bengal School Service Commission (selections of persons for Appointment to the Post of Teachers) Rules, 2007 and as subsequently amended / supersession and as subsequently amended and the West Bengal School Service Commission (selection of persons for Appointment to the Post of Non-Teaching staff) Rules, 2009 and as subsequently amended.
2. If any omission or commitment of error or any mistake of any nature on the part of any applicant is detected at any stage of the entire selection process, his/her candidature is liable to be rejected.
3. If a candidate leaves the fields blank for any one or more among Name, Address, Subject, Category, Signature, Academic Details, Photograph will lead to his cancellation of his candidature.
4. Incomplete Form or Form completed with incorrect information will lead to the cancellation of the candidature.
5. **Admit Card shall not be issued for the following ineligibilities: -**
 - a) Signature of applicant in capital letters or signature of the applicant in the testimonials not tallying with the signature put in the application form.
 - b) Signature missing in any part of the application where it is required.
 - c) Under age or over age with respect to caste category.
 - d) Applied for Vacancy/Post not advertised.
 - e) Applicant not having proper educational qualification.
 - f) Date of birth missing or age proof certificate not submitted.
 - g) Candidate applied for more than one post of the same designation.
 - h) Caste certificate not from competent authority, in case of posts reserved for SC/ST/OBC.
 - i) Caste certificate not submitted, in case of posts reserved for SC/ST/OBC.
 - j) Combination subject less than 300 marks.
 - k) Degree not recognized or approved by the UGC.
 - l) Subject studied neither at the Graduation Level nor at the Post Graduation Level for the post of teachers advertised herewith.

B. Disqualification of In-Service Teachers in the same Category of Post:

In service teachers, without completion of 02 (two) years of continuous approved service as on the last date of the submission of application form for Assistant Teacher, as



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teacher in the institution he has last joined, cannot apply for the post of Assistant Teacher in the same category/post, vide rule 18 as per the notification dated 21/12/2011 of School Education Department, Government of West Bengal.

C. Other Information:

- a) Before submitting the Application Form, the candidate should satisfy himself that he fulfills all the eligibility criteria as laid down in the prospectus/advertisement to avoid rejection of the Application Form.
- b) No mark sheet shall be issued to the candidates.
- c) Application fees shall not be refunded under any circumstance.
- d) On receipt of the Admit Card, the candidate should check it very carefully and bring discrepancy /discrepancies, if any, to the notice of the school authorities. The candidate must bring the Admit Card to the Examination Hall to secure Admission for the written examination.
- e) If a candidate writes his name or put any special marks at any place in the Examination Booklet, which may disclose in any way the identity of the candidate, he shall render himself liable to be disqualified.
- f) Candidate must abide by the instructions as may be specified on the cover page of the Examination Booklet or any other instructions as may be printed in the Admit Card or may be given by the officer-in-charge of the center.
- g) No T.A./D.A. will be allowed to the candidate for appearing at the Examination Centre.
- h) Use of Calculator/Mobile Phone/Log Tables (other than any instruction provided in the Examination Booklet) is not permitted.
- i) A candidate found canvassing in any form and/or guilty of indiscipline in the Examination Hall or using unfair means of any nature or noting down the question, except on Answer Sheet shall be liable to be disqualified from this Examination and future Tests also.

Structure function relationship of cell and its organelles and different tissues.

2. Biochemical and Biophysical Principles involved in Human systems:

Definition and physiological significance of diffusion, osmosis, dialysis, ultra filtration, adsorption and absorption. Definition, classification and physiological importance of colloids. Definition of enzymes, co-enzymes and isozymes with examples. Factors influencing enzyme action.

3. (a) Conservation of matter and energy in human systems: Structures in relation to functions of alimentary tract. Composition, functions and regulations of secretion of digestive juices including bile. Digestion and absorption of dietary carbohydrates, proteins and fats.

(b) **Nutrition:** Definition of balanced diet. ACU. Marasmus, Kwashiorkor, PCM, Dietary fibers, Vitamins: definition, classification, functions and symptoms and daily requirements, Hypervitaminosis.

Minerals - Dietary sources and nutritional importance.

BMR : Definition and factors affecting. **R. Q.:** Definition, factors affecting and significance, Biological value of protein.

SDA : Definition and importance.

4. Blood :

Composition and functions. Origin and functions of plasma proteins. Plasmapheresis. Bone marrow. Formed elements of blood --- their formation and functions. Haemoglobin: Different types of compounds and derivatives. Blood volume and its regulation.



Coagulation of Blood: Mechanism and factors influencing, anticoagulants, and disorders of coagulation. Blood groups – ABO and Rh, Thalassemia. TC, DC, Haemoglobin estimation, Bleeding and clotting time. Anaemia - definition and types, Leukocytosis, Leukopenia, leukemia, purpura - definitions.

5. **Cardiovascular System:**

(a) Heart – Properties of cardiac muscle, Origin and propagation of cardiac impulse, various events (atrial and ventricular) of cardiac cycle, heart sounds, heart rate, cardiac output and factors affecting its regulation.

6. **Respiratory System:**

Anatomy and histology of respiratory passage and organs. Role of respiratory muscles in respiration. Artificial respiration. Significance of anatomical and physiological dead space. Lung volumes and capacity. Exchange of respiratory gases between (i) lung and blood, and (ii) blood and tissues. Transport of O₂ and CO₂ in blood. Neural and chemical regulation of respiration. Hypoxia.

7. **Renal Physiology:**

Structure – function relationship of kidney. Mechanism of formation of urine and physiology of micturition. Acid-base regulation by the kidney. Non-excretory functions of kidney.

8. **Nerve-Muscle Physiology:**

Structures of different types of muscles. Muscular contraction and relaxation, Isotonic and isometric contractions. Properties of muscles. Structure and classification of nerves. Origin and propagation of nerve impulse. Velocity of impulse in different types of nerve fibres. Properties of nerve fibre. Synapses: Structures, different types and mechanism of synaptic transmission. Myoneural junction: Structure and mechanism of impulse transmission. Degeneration and regeneration of nerve fibre.

9. **Nervous System and Sensory Physiology:**

Reflex action --- Definition, reflex arc, classification, properties. Functions of spinal cord. Outline of functions of brain stem. A brief idea of structure, connections and functions of cerebellum. Functions of thalamus and hypothalamus. Cerebral cortex –



Histological structures and localization of functions. Cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) - Composition, formation, circulation and functions. Functions of sympathetic and parasympathetic nervous system. Classification of general and special senses and their receptors.

Weber-Fechner law. Basic concept of receptor adaptation. Olfaction and gustation - Structure of sensory organ, neural pathway of smell and taste sensation, mechanism of taste sensation, after taste. Olfactory adaptation. Audition - Structure of ear, auditory pathway, mechanism of hearing, pitch perception and perception of loudness. Vision - Structure of the eyes, histology of retina, visual pathway, chemical changes of retina on exposure to light; mechanism and pathway of accommodation, error refraction, after image, light and dark adaptation elementary idea of colour vision and colour blindness.

10. **Skin and Regulation of Body Temperature:**

Structure and functions of skin. Insensible and sensible perspiration. Physiology of sweat secretion and its regulation. Regulation of body temperature.

11. **Endocrine system:**

Anatomy of endocrine system. Classification of Hormones. Basic concept of regulation of hormone actions. Elementary idea of hormone action. Histological structure, hormones and functions pituitary, thyroid, parathyroid, adrenal and pancreas. Hypothalamic control of anterior and posterior pituitary. Hypo and hyperactive states of pituitary gland, thyroid and adrenal cortex.

Brief idea of the origin and functions of rennin-angiogenesis, prostaglandins, erythropoietin and melatonin. Elementary idea of gastrointestinal hormones

12. **Reproductive Physiology:**

Primary and accessory sex organs and secondary sex characters.

Testis - Histology, spermatogenesis, testicular hormones and their functions. Ovary - Histology, Oogenesis, ovarian hormones and their functions. Oestrus and menstrual cycles and their hormonal control. Development of mammary gland and lactation.

Group –A

1. DEFINITION AND SCOPE OF ECONOMICS :

Basic problems in every economic society and their solution in different economic systems. A general view of the price system. The elementary theory of demand, supply and market price.
